NAPLAN 2021 - Years 3 and 5

This week on Thursday the 25th March, we will take part in a "Coordinated Practice NAPLAN test" at 11.30 am. This is to test the system's readiness and capacity to run the test in May. Students have been using the online practice test environment to get used to the functions. All parents in Year 3 and Year 5 will receive information regarding NAPLAN this year that will occur from the 11th May to the 21st May 2021. The following outlines the proposed NAPLAN dates at Prouille for 2021.

25 th March	-	Year 3 and Year 5 Coordinated Practice Test
11 th May	-	Year 3 Writing Test – (Paper based)
11 th May	-	Year 5 Writing Test – (online)
12 th May	-	Year 3 and Year 5 – Reading Test (online)
12 th May	-	Year 3 and Year 5 – Conventions of Language Test (online)
13 th May	-	Year 3 and Year 5 – Numeracy Test (online)

AUSTRALIAN EARLY DEVELOPMENT CENSUS – AEDC

The Australian Government carries out a national census that measures early childhood development of children in their first year of full-time school. The AEDC is not a test or a ranking system for schools. Census data is used by early childhood educators and health services, local councils, community groups, schools and governments to help plan and allocate the right type of services, resources and support for communities.
